NEW - Boyden Library Home Services

Coming soon! Boyden Library, along with Foxborough Council on Aging, will be launching a new service to bring library materials to homebound patrons.

Boyden Library's Home Services Program delivers library materials to Foxborough residents who are unable to visit the library due to a physical condition.

A Foxborough resident requesting homebound delivery must meet the criteria established by the Board of Library Trustees.

- Permanent physical disabilities that prevent visiting the library.
- Temporary physical limitation that restricts visiting the library.
- Mobility issues that prohibit an individual from visiting the library.

Materials that meet the needs and interests of the homebound patron will be selected by a librarian. All attempts will be made to select appropriate items; however, the library is not responsible for the content of material. If you do not have a Library Card, one may be obtained with proof of identification. Homebound patrons are responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged materials and must follow the rules and regulations of a Boyden Library card holder.

To facilitate delivery, a questionnaire will be available on the library's website: www.boydenlibrary.org or at the circulation desk to determine genres and resources patrons may be interested in. All volunteers for the Home Services Program are CORI checked.
