January: The third Monday in January is Martin Luther King Jr. Day; look into reading <u>Between the</u> <u>World and Me</u> by Ta-Nehisi Coates or <u>Citizen: An American Lyric</u> by Claudia Rankine.

February: February is of course most famous for Valentine's Day; try reading <u>Paris: A Love Story</u> by Kati Marton or the classic <u>Wuthering Heights</u> by Emily Bronte.

March: For women's history month, try <u>Dust Bowl Girls</u> by Lydia Reeder or <u>My Own Words</u> by Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

April: National Pet Day is April 11; try <u>Secret Language of Dogs</u> by Victoria Stilwell or <u>Faithfully</u> <u>Yours</u> by Peggy Frezon.

May: Armed Forces Day falls on the third Saturday of the month and if you enjoy military history or historical fiction, it's hard to go wrong with Jeff Schaara; give <u>To the Last Man</u> a read.

June: June is the month of Father's Day, so for a more lighthearted though bittersweet story of fathers and their children, check out Life, Death, and Bialys: A Father/Son Baking Story.

July: For the Fourth of July, read up on American history by checking out <u>The Turncoat</u> by Donna Thorland.

August: The 9<sup>th</sup> of August is Book Lovers Day; have carte blanche this month!

September: Some choices for Labor Day (celebrate that last week of summer) are <u>Empire Rising</u> by Thomas Kelly and <u>Accordion Crimes</u> by Annie Proulx.

October: There's no shortage of books to read for Halloween, no matter where your tastes lie. Try Shirley Jackson's <u>The Haunting of Hill House</u>.

November: For something suspenseful, try <u>Bitter Harvest</u> by Susan Bowden. For something humorous, <u>Turkey Day Murder</u> by Leslie Meier

December: No matter what winter holiday you celebrate, you're sure to find a festive book for the occasion. Try <u>The Snow Child</u> by Eowyn Ivey.

# From the Children's Room Margi Rossetti

There is a lot happening at the Children's Room this busy spring, but I would like to begin by thanking everyone who contributed to our Boston Bruins PJ Drive last winter. With a goal to collect 100 pair of pajamas, the Boyden Library collected more than 120 pair. The pajamas were distributed to children in need throughout the Commonwealth through Cradles to Crayons and the Department of Children and Families Fund. We saw new pajamas come in every day for babies, children, and teens. Statewide, this year's drive collected 12,150 new sets of pajamas. I'm so happy that we were able to take part in this wonderful effort and once again, the residents of Foxboro showed their generosity.

Children's programs to look forward to this spring include "Spring Into Music with Miss Pam from Musical Journeys." Miss Pam Atanasoff will return on Monday, May 15, with springtime music and activities just right for children ages 9 months- 5 years. Miss Pam will hold one session at 10 a.m. and another at 11 a.m. in the Community Meeting Room. Please register for one time slot (please, no group registrations) beginning May 3. All children must be accompanied by an adult. Register online at www.boydenlibrary.org. Click on the Events Calendar and go to the program date where you will see the registration button. Or call the Children's Room at 508-543-1246. Sponsored by the Friends of the Boyden Library; there is no charge to attend.

"Kindergarten Readiness" will be presented by Michele Davidson of Self Help Inc. on Thursdays, May 11-June 15 at 1:15-2:30 p.m. This program is intended for children who will be making the transition between preschool and kindergarten in Fall, 2017. The focus of the group will be to promote kindergarten readiness skills along with learning how to make the kindergarten transition less stressful for you and your child. Children will participate in meeting time, story time, a theme-based project, and music and movement. There will be a 15 minute "Parent Time" at the end of each session. Registrations will be taken at the Self Help Inc. site at www.selfhelpcpc.org.

"Hugh Hanley's Circle of Songs" will take place on Monday, June 19, at 11:15 a.m. Preschoolers to age 6 and their grown-ups are welcome to attend. Get ready for this sing-along, dance-along, and hop-along musical program. Hugh Hanley, a former preschool teacher, brings a variety of instruments and presents a lively interactive program. Registration begins on June 5 online at www.boydenlibrary.org or call the Children's Desk at 508-543-1246. Sponsored by the Friends of the Boyden Library; there is no charge to attend.

Even though the calendar says spring, summer program planning is well underway. This year's Summer Reading theme is "Build a Better World." Like every year, children will be encouraged to read throughout the summer and will receive a prize for each week they take part in the six-week program. Registration will begin the week of June 19 and the program will last through August 6. Look for a balloon-twisting workshop with Ed the Wizard, a Yoga camp, another Harry Potter Trivia event and many more super activities—all sponsored by the Friends of the Boyden Library and offered free of charge.

New this spring in the Children's Room is a puzzle exchange. Puzzles for kids ages 12 and younger are available to take home and return when you are through. There is no check-out of the items, so a library card is not required. If you have children's puzzles at home that are no longer used, we would welcome them to become part of our swap. We only ask that all of the pieces are contained in the original box.




### Volunteers Always Welcome
