Report from Library Director: Manny Leite

- Concert Series on Sundays is doing very well
- Pam Riccio is doing very well in her new position

Trustee Report: Kevin Penders

- Focused on Budget for several months, spending a lot of time discussing the YA Librarian position
- Elections are coming up in May. Kevin will be running again for the 5th term. Tom Magee will not be returning. They are looking for someone to fill this position.
- Starting to plan for the Spinney Speaker Series in the fall for the 4th year in a row.

Presentation on Young Adult Librarian Position: Manny Leite

- Visits to library are increasing; Circulation is up dramatically in the last 3 years, mostly because of technology use
- Mission Statement is failing because we are underserving our young adults
- There are experts in Young Adult Literature, teen population (12-18)
- 9 cities/towns within SAILS have a Young Adult Librarians
- We are considered a newly built library, 11 have a YA Librarian
- There are many programs that attract teens like Anime, Video games breakdancing, etc.
- How will it help teens: prepare teens for colleges, careers, and life through programs and services
- Young Adults can help with service projects
- Teen Advisory Boards have held various programs and events. This enables teens to learn leadership and teamwork skills
- Helps bridge the gap between the community and library
- Sample Activities: movie nights with a canned food drive, work with Foxboro YMCA & Friends, College Admission Programs, collect toys for animal shelter, make greeting cards for Assisted Living Programs
- Target Audience: Ahern (822), high school (571 excluding Seniors), Charter School, Sage School, Bishop Feehan, SE Regional, Homeschool teens
- This is money well spent
- We have a Young Adult Section in our library already but no one to lead, perhaps let YA Librarian decorate and make the space more inviting
- We need the public to support us at Town Meeting, Town Manager approved a part time position rather than full time. Manny and Trustee will appear before Advisory Committee on 2/12 at 8 pm
- Manny would appreciate letters of support for this position to the Foxboro Reporter before the Annual Meeting May 11 and let Advisory Committee know we fully support this issue
- Jen Ooi made a motion to fully support the hiring of a Young Adult Librarian, second by Janice. Motion was passed unanimously
