## Materials Available at the Library



### Exploring Your Family's History Using Software

Looking to research your family tree? Want to discover who owned your home in the 1800's? Boyden Library has those answers with the Ancestry Library database. Ancestry Library is an extensive resource for genealogy and historical information that can only be used at the Boyden Library. However, this does not mean the information you retrieve can only be accessed in the Boyden Library. When you discover a document using Ancestry Library, the information and document can be saved using the "Send Document" feature. By inserting your email address, Ancestry Library will send an email describing how to access your report at home. Another great feature about Ancestry Library is their enormous database. The database has over 1.5 billion names and includes records from the U.S. Census, military records, courts, land and probate records, vital and church records, directories and passenger lists.

And that's only the beginning, please stop by the Boyden Library and explore your family's history today!
