With all the hype on new streaming services like Disney+, Apple+ and the upcoming HBO Max in 2020, I like to share two streaming services we offer at the Boyden Library free of charge! All you need is a Boyden Library Card.

Hoopla is a groundbreaking digital media service that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, eBooks, comics and TV shows to enjoy on your computer, tablet, or phone – and even your TV! With no waiting, titles can be streamed immediately, or downloaded to phones or tablets for offline enjoyment later. There are hundreds of thousands of titles to choose from, with more being added daily. Hoopla is like having your public library at your fingertips. Anytime. Anywhere. With your Boyden Library card, you can instantly download up to three titles per month with NO WAITING.

Freegal is a downloadable music service. All you need is your Boyden Library card to gain access to the Sony Music Entertainment catalog which offers hundreds of thousands of songs, over 100 genres of music, and more than 50 record labels, all without having to download software or have any digital rights management (DRM) issues to deal with. Freegal allows patrons to download up to three songs to your phone, computer or tablet per week.

And that's just the tip of the iceberg. Look for a new, movie-centric streaming service coming to Boyden Library in the Summer of 2020.

As we embark on a new year, we thought it would be informative to share with you our "FRIENDS" what the Friends Group had accomplished in 2019.

We began the year with changes to the Board of Directors- Janice Rosado assumed the Presidency and immediately had a positive impact by opening our Book Store and Last Chapter and continues to manage them along with her other duties. These were an instant success. She was also responsible for starting a collaborative working arrangement with an outside book dealer to list and sell selected books on the internet all year long. Again, this has proven highly successful.

We had three new members elected to the Board at the Annual Meeting in February; Bob Boynton, Sara Halton and Jennifer Linskey, all of whom bring enthusiasm, experience and a wealth of new ideas to the Board. Bob became an At-Large member and the "go-to" operations guy; Sara took over the Membership Chair and Jennifer assumed the Media/PR Chair and helps to edit the newsletter. We also said goodbye to Liz Karvonen and Laurie Magee who served on the Board for several years as Newsletter Chair (Liz) and Membership Chair (Laurie). We are also losing another Board member, Barbara Massey who will be stepping down in January as she has moved out of town. Our thanks to all of them for their years of commitment and friendship.

Your financial support through membership dues and book sales helped us to sponsor an unprecedented number of programs this past year. There were 20 children's programs covering various themes such as science, crafts, yoga, nature and animals as well the very popular Teddy Bear picnic held on the Common during the summer. This year over 65 children attended, and each child was given a book as a prize. At the young adult level, we sponsored four visits from the One Up Games and at the adult level there were 14 programs that included nine music programs; Dan Shaughnessy, the author; a genealogy program; Harry Potter Trivia Night; The Traveling Librarian program, and the No Irish Need Apply program. These were all available free of charge and well attended.

In addition to these programs, museum passes, book rentals of newly released best sellers, e-books for Kindles as well as newly released DVDs for rent were made possible by your generosity and continue to be in high demand by library patrons.

Story Time for children ages 3-6 is held at 1:30PM. on Wednesday. Longer stories, music, rhymes, interactive thinking games and a simple craft make-up the Story Time program. All story programs take place in the Story/Craft Room.

Family Evening Story Time does not meet during the first Winter Session. But if you stop by the Children's Department on Thursday evenings, children will able to make a simple craft. Family Evening Story Time will resume with Session 4 on February 27th.
