From the Youth Services Dept.

I am so honored and excited to begin my journey as the new Senior Youth Services Librarian at the Boyden Library. This is truly a wonderful library with an outstanding staff and unique opportunities for outreach.

The Friends of Boyden Library were quick to welcome me. Several Friends visited me during my first week to make introductions. I also regularly see Friends re-stocking the popular Friends' Book Sale Shelves near the children's DVDs.

Through the Friends' generous sponsorship, the Youth Services Department was able to offer 2 exciting Winter Break programs: A Noon Year's Eve Party with Goody Bags, and Pop Up Art School: Miniature Chocolate Box. For both programs, participants picked up a kit at the library and then participated in a Zoom program.

For the Noon Year's Eve Party, participants made crafts, played Bingo, and counted down to Noon on December 31. The Pop Up Art School program was directed towards youth ages 10-18. Kits included clay, paint, and tools for sculpting a miniature chocolate box and adorable animal bonbons. Registration for both programs filled quickly. All 40 Noon Year's Eve Goody Bags, and all 15 Miniature Chocolate Box kits made their way into the hands of eager kids.

The Youth Services Department continues to offer Virtual Storytime and Crafts To-Go. "Stories and Songs with Miss Kacee" is posted to Facebook on Wednesdays at 11:00 a.m. Crafts To-Go are available most Mondays at 2:00 p.m., with weeks alternating between crafts for ages 3-8 and 8-13.

Future plans include online reading programs for 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten and Summer Reading, outdoor Story times at different locations throughout Foxborough once the weather gets warmer, and Virtual American Sign Language Storytime performed by ASL Honor Students from Foxborough High School.
