Friends of Boyden Library Fall Speaker Series

Building on a successful Author Series in the Spring of 2014, the Friends of Boyden Library are presenting (and funding!) a Fall Speaker Series at the Boyden Library this fall.

The Series will open on Wednesday, October 22nd at 7:00 pm with an appearance by Jeff Peterson, publisher of the Sun Chronicle, and author of the recently published "Legendary Locals of Foxborough". "Legendary Locals", from Arcadia Publishing, reveals the intriguing characters and everyday citizens who have made Foxboro's history legendary. "It shares the stories of unique individuals and groups, past and present, which have had a lasting impact on the community," said the Foxboro Reporter on April 24, 2014.

A lifelong Foxboro resident, Peterson holds a Bachelor's degree in journalism from Boston University, and served both as a Foxboro Selectman and a member of the Planning Board in the 1980's.

Jeff will speak about the process of putting together a local "historical" book that features both historic and contemporary subjects. Following his talk, Jeff will be on hand to sign copies of "Legendary Locals of Foxborough." Copies of the book will be available for purchase.

Nancy Sporborg and Pat Piper will visit the Library on Wednesday, November 19th at 7:00 pm for their multimedia presentation "It's Not About the Hike." This hour-long program highlights the journey of two 50-plus yearolds who decided to climb the 100 Highest Mountains in New England. Nancy Sporborg and Pat Piper are two ordinary women who went on an extraordinary journey over the mountain summits and into their hearts. This is the story of what they found inside themselves as they hiked over 1,600 miles to the top of 244 mountains through all four seasons.

This presentation is for everyone – hikers and non-hikers, people who are sedentary or active, outdoor enthusiasts and indoor homebodies, 10 year olds and 90 year olds and everyone in between. The presentation is NOT about the hike; it is an inspirational and motivational program about pushing ourselves outside of our comfort zones, overcoming our fears, finding our passions and living our lives to the fullest.

This talk is a multi-media presentation including movies, music and photographs. It is both humorous and touching, as the speakers share their personal lives in a way that makes the message and learning universal.

The book, "It's Not About the Hike", will be offered for sale after the presentation. The book contains 360 pages, over 245 color pictures, and 60 inspirational hike reports for \$35. If you enjoy the presentation, you'll love the book. Cont'd on P. 7



From The Children's Room

Thanks to the support of the Friends of the Boyden Library, the Children's Department was able to provide a great summer reading program this year, filled with lots of fun events and prizes. Over 330 kids registered for FIZZ! BOOM! READ! with 838 people in attendance at special events and story programs. Alchemy of the Laboratory with Ed the Wizard, The Teddy Bear Picnic, and The Whalemobile were just a few of the popular programs the Friends sponsored this summer. Happy Birthday Boyden Library Events such as Mrs. Dow's Art Cart, The Hunger Games Survival Program with Matt Gabriel and Ladybug Story Time with Kaye Naylor and Julie Haney helped us celebrate the first anniversary of the opening of the newly expanded and renovated library.

Now that we are settled into the fall routine, keep in mind that our regular story time and Mother Goose on the Loose programs are back. Look for Mother Goose on the Loose for infants- age 3 on Tuesday and Thursday at 11 a.m. Story Time for 3-6 year-olds takes place on Wednesday at 1:30 p.m. For people who are busy with work and school during the day, Family Evening Story Time meets on Thursday at 7 p.m. Children are welcome to wear their pajamas and bring along a stuffed animal to this program. Story programs run in six-week sessions with a one-week break in between.

The Friends of the Boyden Library also sponsor many children's entertainment and educational programs throughout the year, mainly planned for school vacation times. You'll find program listings on the Boyden Library website (click on Children's Services or Calendar of Events), our Facebook page, in the library column that appears bimonthly in the Foxboro Reporter, on Foxborough Patch, and on Foxboro Cable Access.

For children and families who visit the library for homework purposes, the Children's Room has four internet computers available to children ages 13 and younger. Before a child can use an internet computer, their parent or legal guardian must visit the Children's Room and sign an internet permission form. The computers can be signed out for up to an hour.

Most important, the beginning of the school year is a great time for children to register for their own library cards. Children should be able to print their name (first names are okay). Parents or legal guardians must come in with the child to present something showing proof of address (a driver's license or an official piece of mail) and a photo ID and to sign the registration form. Lost library cards can be replaced for \$1.00. Please remember that library cards must be presented when checking materials out of the library.




