We have a lot of exciting programs planned this Spring and Summer for all to enjoy at Boyden Library! Here are some of the upcoming adult programs being offered:





YOUTH SERVICES



Happy Spring from the Children's Department! We had a wonderful start to 2025 here in the Children's Room.

• We added a new addition to our collection: a Tonie Box and Tonie Figurines! The Tonie Box is a screen-free audio player for kids 3+ that is great for bedtime stories, music, and education. The corresponding Tonies are figurines that when placed on top of the box automatically start playing. Check them out next time you visit!

• Our new database Fiero Code went live. Fiero Code is a gamified coding platform designed to engage kids, teens, and adults in learning computer

programming through self-paced lessons and interactive challenges. Our Super Coders club has been using it frequently and really enjoying it. Library card holders can access Fiero Code through the Kids Online Resources tab on our website.

- We celebrated Take Your Child to the Library Day on Sat, Feb. 1, with a Library themed story time, DIY bookmark station, fairytale photo book, and a fun scavenger hunt to test the kids' book finding skills.
- For February vacation week, we had a Black History Month scavenger hunt all week, as well as Kids Karaoke and a special performance by Evan of Music at the Blissful.
- In March, we prepared for our annual Community Reads event with author J. Courtney Sullivan by hosting a Home is Where the Heart Is story time with a special appearance from Parker the Therapy Dog and a traditional Wampanoag pottery class led by Plimoth Patuxet Museums.

2025 Summer Reading Program: Level Up At Your Library! This will be an 8-week program starting Mon, June 23, and ending Fri, Aug 15. We will be offering Beanstack to our participants, an easy-to-use website/app where kids ages 0-12 can track their reading and activities over the summer to earn digital badges and real rewards. Children ages 5-12 will get a silicone charm bracelet when they register. When certain milestones are reached on Beanstack, kids will be prompted to come to the library to choose a Croc charm to add to the bracelet. They can collect up to 5 charms over the summer. Babies-Age 4 will get to choose a stuffie each time they unlock special badges on Beanstack! Every badge that you unlock gives you 3 digital raffle tickets that you can put towards the prize of your choice! At the end of the 8 weeks, we will be holding a large prize drawing for free passes and gift cards to local organizations such as Tree Top Adventures, Ice Cream Beach Club, Ally's Cookies, Monster Mini Golf, Xtreme Craze, and more. This summer will be jam packed with fun, educational programs and performances and we can't wait for you to join us!


