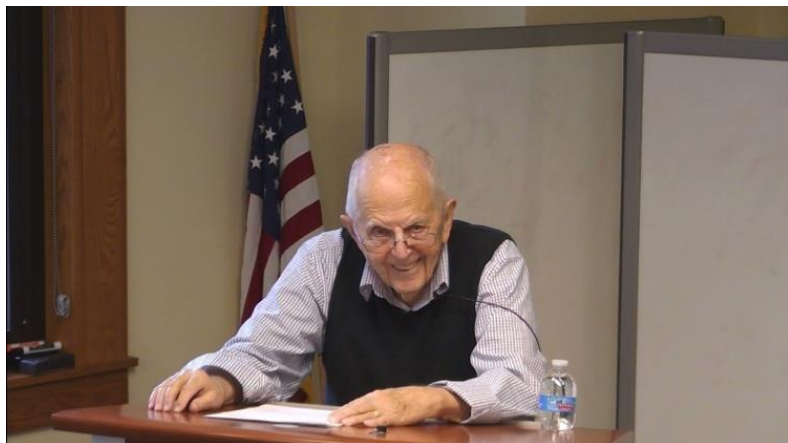

Friends 60th Anniversary – Jack Authelet



On November 14, 2021, Jack Authelet, Foxborough's Historian, helped the Friends of Boyden Library celebrate our 60th Anniversary. Here is a recap of Jack's presentation:

Boyden Library was founded in 1871 and was originally located in Memorial Hall. It was named after Uriah Boyden, who donated money for the first books. By the 1950s, the post-war population boom meant that a larger facility was sorely needed. In 1961 the Library Trustees formed the Friends of Boyden Library, and their first major task was planning and fundraising for a new building. Rex Bristol donated his property on the corner of Bird &

Baker Streets and in 1964, Friends President Edward Lawson presented the building proposal at Town Meeting.

Once their new library was complete, the townspeople were still confronted with a major problem – how to move the books? The solution was a huge human chain beginning on the steps of Memorial Hall, continuing across two streets, through the Common and up the stairs to the library. That exemplifies the Spirit of Foxborough!

Jack expressed his pride in the wide variety of programs sponsored by the Friends for townspeople of all ages. The annual Teddy Bear Picnic on the Common is a cherished memory for many residents and is a highlight of the many programs sponsored by the Friends.

During the recent remodel and expansion of the Boyden Library, the Friends made a substantial contribution to finance the Friends Community Room. Jack is proud that a multitude of people from a wide variety of organizations meet here at no charge. The Community Room also regularly hosts wonderful art by members of Foxborough Art Association, local artists and Foxborough High School art students. Jack acknowledged that the Friends have been a big part of this community and he knows they will continue to contribute their time and resources in the future to the library.


