FROM THE DIRECTOR



The Boyden Library continues to be a thriving community hub! With wrapping up our fiscal year, which ended on June 30, I'm excited to share some highlights:

- Total visits to the library: 108,573 (up from 94,420 last year)
- Total circulation of physical materials: 130,386 (compared to 128,559 last year)
- Total programs: 527 with 8,082 total attendees (up from 357 programs with 5,127 attendees last year)

We also had an incredibly successful summer program, largely thanks to the generous support of the Friends of Boyden Library. They sponsored a variety of programs and provided prizes for participants of all ages this summer.

Additionally, we have several important updates to share with the community:

- Book Club Kits are now available for checkout! Each kit is designed to support your next book club
 meeting and includes five copies of the selected title, discussion questions, author information, and
 suggestions for similar reads. The current collection features the following titles:
 - The Demon of Unrest: A Saga of Hubris, Heartbreak, and Heroism at the Dawn of the Civil War by Erik Larson
 - o First Lie Wins by Asley Elston
 - o The Frozen River by Ariel Lawhon
 - o Nora Goes Off Script by Annabel Monaghan
 - o Real Americans by Rachel Khong
- We've partnered with Ompractice to offer library cardholders free, unlimited access to online fitness and mindfulness classes. Explore a wide range of classes at a time that fits your schedule.
- In collaboration with MassDOT, Patriot Place, and the Boston Public Library, we've launched *Browse*, *Borrow*, *Board* at the Foxborough Commuter Rail. Patrons can browse an online catalog of eBooks and audiobooks, check them out, and enjoy them while commuting.
- Starting in October, Social Work intern Stephanie Neipris will hold office hours at the Boyden Library on Tuesdays from 4-6pm and Thursdays from 10am-12pm. She will offer assistance with information and referrals, benefits assistance, mental health and substance use resources, brief counseling, and more.






Dear Lesleyann,

The large-print books you had were terrific as well, as we've been getting more requests for large print over the past year.

So, please accept my thanks for another really valuable donation to the Prison Book Program and its readers in prison. You could not be kinder or more welcoming. Don't books just bring out the best in people??

I sincerely appreciate your help in providing me books. I have been locked-up behind a door for a lot of years and don't have family or funds to help me with literature and it means a lot to me beaccuse I have almost nothing in my life to look forward to and no one I can depend on in my life anymone but you guys have been there for me durring some dark and loney times and never refused to send me something. Thanks from the bottom of my heart!





When I found myself invarcerated, I rediscovered my love for books, I read to escape the continues of a juil cell and the montany of life behind bars. The more I read, the more I wanted to read. The more I learned, the more questions I had.

Everytime I opened a book, I was opening my mind - to new I deas, new considerations and new possibilities.

The power of the written word is the conviction it makes between minds, the ability to view the world through a new perspective - even if it is similar to yours. I have long been interested in history, sociology and politics, but over the past few years I have also been profunding moved by the philosophy and reality that can be observed in fiction.

TEEN HAPPENINGS AT BOYDEN LIBRARY



Summer reading for the teens was eventful, with forty-four sign ups, up from fifteen last year, and 23,705 logged minutes, compared to last year's 7687! I want to thank the Friends of Boyden Library for sponsoring many of the fun prizes, such as three fidget pens, 3D Doodler Pen, and the most popular prize of all: a Podcast Bundle Kit for 2.

The Friends of Boyden Library sponsored one of the most fun programs thus far, Cupcake Wars with ConnectED & Inspired of Milford, MA. Teens were given 5 cupcakes each, and with each cupcake challenged in a span of a couple of minutes to decorate the cupcake.
